



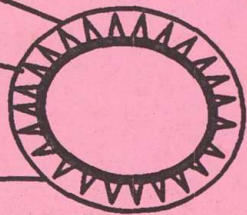

Legends and truths about the Paramel family

It is believed that the Brahmins who had been converted by St. Thomas escaped the enmity of their fellow Hindus by fleeing from Chavakkad (Cursed land) and settled in Kunnamkulam. They designed the whole village in the fashion of a cross and established four churches at the four ends of the cross roads. Considering the safety of the family members, they built their houses very close to each other and their construction plans are same, simple and similar to Jewish Township in Jerusalem. History proclaims that St. Thomas a disciple of Jesus Christ, first stepped in Indian soil at Malankara (Maliankara) at Kodugallur (Cranganoor) near Kunnamkulam in AD 52 . We boast that the oldest seaport in India was Cranganoor ~~in~~ ~~the~~ ~~erstwhile~~ ~~Cochin~~ ~~state~~. After St. Thomas arrival, several Jews emigrated to India through the same route. The recent excavation of Jewish cemetery near Chowanoor with many hemispherical tombstones will only prove that there was a Jewish settlement in Kunnamkulam. The stature, colour, and personality of many citizens there resemble Jewish people. The peculiar names Iyyu, Ittoop, Chummar, Chakkunny, and Mathiri, Elachar and Kunjannam etc. are used only in Kunnamkulam, which have a Jewish accent. When Lord Linlithgow, the then viceroy of India visited Cochin on the 7th January 1939, which was the Christmas day of eastern churches, a greeting card depicting the photos of Malankara (Maliankara) where St. Thomas first stepped in India was presented to him which he highly appreciated. While coming down from Trichur to Kunnamkulam, you may notice a big signboard at the entrance of municipal limits, announcing " The cultural capital of Kerala". In fact, Kathakali and other cultural dances originated from Kakkad in Kunnamkulam. This town was very famous for commerce and business that progressed through waterways at Chavvakad. The caves in Kakkad and Chowanoor, probably inhabited by the saints of the past, proclaim the early civilisation of Kunnamkulam. The frequent occurrence of the wayside offering churches and other huge church building are proof of their deep spiritual desires. The different kinds of

Christian rituals that they still follow during their worship services and other religious occasions are different from other Christians. This difference can be attributed to their Brahmin origin and the deep-rooted culture in them. The use of elephants during festivals, way side offering churches, overflowing paddy in a measure crowned with coconut flower, bronze oil lamps, Thali, giving sweetened coconut to the bride and bridegroom, pounding the dried paddy, giving Pudava to the bride, the feast after the funerals, are all believed to be copied from the Brahmin culture. The practice of calling their fathers as "Appa" is also a very common practise among the Brahmins in this area.

Paramel family originated from the south wing of the four cross roads mentioned earlier and it is known as South bazaar. Although there is an existing family named "Paramel" in Travancore side, the clearcut differences in the culture and practices shows this Paramel family is in no way related to that Paramel family.

The first known Paramel family lived in a house seen opposite to the present three storied building in the South Bazaar. The first person mentioned in the genealogy Chummar (1) lived in that house. Although we do not know much about him, we do know that he had two sons and two daughters. The older son - Chummar's(4) descendants are considered to be the ' Meleh Paramel' and the youngest son - Chakkunny's (7) descendants are considered to be the 'Thazhe Paramel'. Originally they were all strong members of Orthodox Syrian Christian Church, but when the split came in the church, few members of this family also joined the newly formed Mar Thoma Syrian Church. From the Meleh Paramel branch, Itoop son of Iyyu (11) and from the Thazhe Paramel branch Chakkunny (192) son of Chummar(185), and his brother Iyyappan (193) were the first three members of this family who joined the Mar Thoma Church. All the other branches of Paramel family are still in the Jacobite church.

When the metropolitan of the Mar Thoma church died, the church didn't have another bishop to ordain a new bishop. It was then that Mr. Itoop (11) - son of Iyyu (8) came with the idea of inviting the Bishop of Thozhiyoor Church. He used his influence, wealth, courage and his gun to accomplish this task. He accompanied the Thozhiyoor bishop to ordain the new bishop of the Mar Thoma church. If he had not done this, Mar Thoma church would not have had a properly ordained bishop. The above-mentioned Itoop (11) played an important role in the church administration of Arthat Orthodox church before the split. It is said that even now we can see his name engraved on the altar of that church for having built it. Even after the formation of the Mar Thoma church, he still paid earnest attention to the worship needs of the new members of the church. Since many churches were under court case, he built a church called "Christos" in the compound called 'Kandnathu'. He also built one bungalow in the same compound for the English missionary women and a prayer hall at the South bazaar. He kept all the items for the worship and funeral procession, even a 'Kabar', 'Makatty', Cross, and flags for all members who joined in the new Mar Thoma church. It is evident that some members, other than those belonging to Paramel family, who died during this transition period, were buried in Kadnath Paramel cemetery.

In the year (Malayalam era - 1063 Karkadagam 16th) 1888 August, Sri Paramel Iyyu Itoop (11) filed a petition before the Cochin Government. After obtaining permission he constructed a church named 'Christos' at his own land named Kandanath Nijal Parambu of about 2 acre and one cent with a cemetery attached to it under the direct faith of Mar Thoma Church (R.S. no: 116/1 - Survey no: 1484/2 Kunnankulam village). This is the first Mar Thoma church in the Cochin State and British Malabar at that time. Later his grandson Paramel Ipe Chummar, handed over this land to the Mar Thoma Metropolitan. The cemetery in that land is still used for only Paramel family members who belong to the Mar Thoma

church. This is a unique facility to the Paramel family members of Mar thoma church which none else enjoy in Kunnamkulam township. In England, only few Lords have family cemeteries. Princess Diana was buried in her father's (Lord Spencer) family cemetery. While you walk along OLIVET mountain near Jerusalem, you can see a large Jewish cemetery. It was here that Jesus gathered his disciples after his earthly ministry and was taken up in a cloud into heaven. While they looked steadfastly towards heaven as he went up, behold two men stood by them in white apparel and said "men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus who was taken up from you into heaven will so come in like manner as you saw him go into heaven" (Acts 1: 1-11). The Jews still believe that Jesus will descend only on Olivit mount *with a shout, with a voice of archangel, with a trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first*. So they will be very near Him when He descends on the Olivit mount. We also should look forward to the glorious day when all our ancestors who died, will in one group rise up on that day from Paramel cemetery.

In the year 1905 (ME 1081) Sri Koothoor Paramel Chummar Chakkunny (192) constructed Mar Thoma church in Survey no: 314 of Arthat village. Adjacent to the church a cemetery was made for Mar Thoma church members and handed over to the Mar Thoma metropolitan on the condition that the holy communion must be conducted in Mar Thoma faith. Similarly he made a church at Kunnamkulam at South Bazaar in his own land of about 18.5 cents in Survey no: 1187/2,3 (R.S. No: 59/83). This also was handed over to the Mar Thoma metropolitan on the condition stated above. In the year AD 1903 (Malayalam era 1079) a land of about 1.5 acres which was his own property (Survey no: 1440/1 - R.S. No 26/26) was handed over to Rev. Philipose s/o Rev. Philipose Malpan (Ayroor Cherukara) then the general secretary of Malankara Mar Thoma Suvishesha Sangam to construct the houses for the poor and to settle them there. He named that place Chakkunny poor home. The ownership of the land now lays under the direct control

and ownership of the above Sangham and management of this poor home should be done by a member of Kunnamkulam Mar Thoma church on the recommendation of the Suvishesa Sangham and the appointment order (Kalpana) must be ordered by the metropolitan of Mar Thoma church.

Kottilil achen had mentioned in his diaries about those days as follows:

In 1897, Gregsso a missionary from Plimoth Brethren community visited Kunnamkulam to give revival messages. Mr. Gregsso was very happy to see the enthusiasm of the Kunnamkulam Christians for hearing the word of God. Since the women of the area were very reserved and shy toward male missionaries, he was requested to send some missionary women to work among the ladies. As a result of that, in 1900 three women missionaries Mrs. Nicholson, Miss Derrend and Miss Kenny came to Kunnamkulam and started their missionary work. Later on Miss Derrend returned home and married. Miss Kenny also went home and never returned. But a new missionary named Mecabin followed Miss Nicholson. Approximately till 1913 Mrs. Nicholson stayed at Kunnamkulam for her mission work. During their house visits and other activities, Kottilil achen and Kakkunny master helped them as translators. These missionaries also paid regular visits to Thiruvalla to participate in the Centre church activities of the Mar Thoma church. During their missionary work in Kunnamkulam, they always stayed at the bungalow adjacent to the Christos church. When Mrs. Nicholson decided to change her area of operation from Kunnamkulam to Tiruvalla on the advice of the then Saffragan Abraham Mar Thoma bishop, she sent two other missionary ladies - Ms. Mayers and Miss Night. Ms. Mayers concentrated on Gospel work and Miss Night concentrated on medical field. It is interesting to note that in 1901, Bishop Abraham during his deaconhood was sponsored to Wycliff College at Toronto by Mrs. Nicholson, Miss Macabin, and Revd. T. Walker. From the above mentioned, it is very clear that all missionary activities that the early Marthomites enjoyed was mainly by the hospitality of Mr. Itoop son of Iyyu (11). God has fulfilled his

ardent desire for missionary work by making one of his descendants Chummar Verghese (87) take up full time Gospel work after his B.L. degree.

It was during the time of Iyyu (8) son of Chummar, that financial prosperity came to this family. He earned all his wealth mainly by farming forest soils, and doing business. He was a very hardworking person.

Following the footsteps of his father, Itoop (11), the son of Iyyu amassed wealth, fame and popularity by charity and fear of God. He was a well known person in the religious, political and literary world. He established a printing press called "Vidiya Rathnam" and stepped into the world of literature. The well known "Maha Kavi Vallathol" was a frequent visitor of his printing press. He also possessed the first malayalam translation of the Bible (four gospels) printed in Bombay in 1813. Copies of this Bible are only available in CMS press Kottayam and in Serampore University. It is his gene that Ipe Kunju (91) of Akkikave has a writers and poets talent. Mr. Itoop (11) was famous for many things - His double barrel gun, horse and buggy for luxury travel, Veena which was used for music concerts, real solid gold crown for the bride and bridegroom etc.. He constructed the three storied building as extension to the old one story building, which is about 200 years old. The walls of this original building were constructed with twin walls, and centre filled with mud. The breadth of the wall is about two feet similar to the walls of old Arthat church. Ippu (18), son of Itoop was also popular as his father. But still he lived a luxurious life. He liked journeying and stayed in Colombo and had several experiences of the external world

The fame and prosperity of the Thazhe Paramel family started in parallel road of South Bazaar and is not at all different from the Meleh Paramel family. Kottilil achen in his diary mentions about 'Mr. Kuriappan muthalali' (187) like this:-

"When my uncle Uthuppuru became rich, he was called for many consultations with other rich people of the society. Mr. Kuriappan muthalali was very humble and God fearing. He would make sure that God's servants (achens) got a chair to sit, before he sat down. But many other rich people were not like that. They used to ignore God's people." Being a God fearing family, one of his descendants Rev. Kuriakose (212) took up full time ministry and he had the gift of healing the devil possessed persons. It is worth mentioning that Paramel family was also patriotic and one of its member Chakkunny Itoop (206) was in active service in Baghdad and Basra (Iraq). He was also a commander of a work force of more than five hundred people from Kerala for construction work in Assam during World War II.

Among the Thazhe Paramel branch, Chakkunny (192) son of Chummar (185) was also very renowned for wealth, influence and godliness. Among the two brothers of Thazhe Paramel, who came to Mar Thoma church, the eldest Chakkunny (192) did not have any children. But he considered all God's children as his children and gave his land and money to build two Mar Thoma churches in Kunnankulam as noted above. For this reason his body was buried in Arthat Mar Thoma church cemetery rather than burying in the Kandanathu cemetery, which is still considered to be the family cemetery of Paramel Mar Thoma members. It is noteworthy to mention that enormous wealth acquired by Chummar Chakkunny(192) was distributed to all male members of both Thazhe Paramel and Meleh Paramel family descendants after a prolonged litigation. I remember that my father Chummar (41) received his share during 1935 when I was only twelve years old. In later years, this 'Kandanathu' church and compound were given to Metropolitan of Mar Thoma church by Ippu's (18) three sons viz., Chummar (41), Itoop (43), and Ippu (44). The

prayer hall at South Bazaar was also given to Kunnamkulam Mar Thoma church parish. Later the prayer hall was sold out by them defeating the very purpose for which it was gifted.

Let us earnestly pray that God Almighty bless each one of the Paramel family members, to lead a God fearing life, leading to the fulfilment of His will by following the footsteps and good example of the ancestors. The good of the past must be wrought into the structure of the present. We live by yesterday as well as by today and tomorrow. A present cut off from yesterday becomes a cut flower civilisation without roots. The conservatives conserve the values of the past.

Enoch ...the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, behold the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints to execute judgement upon all. Behold he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him,....*The Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the trump of God and the dead in Christ shall rise first, then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air and so shall we ever be with the Lord.*

We should live soberly, righteously and godly in this present world looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the great God and our saviour Jesus Christ.

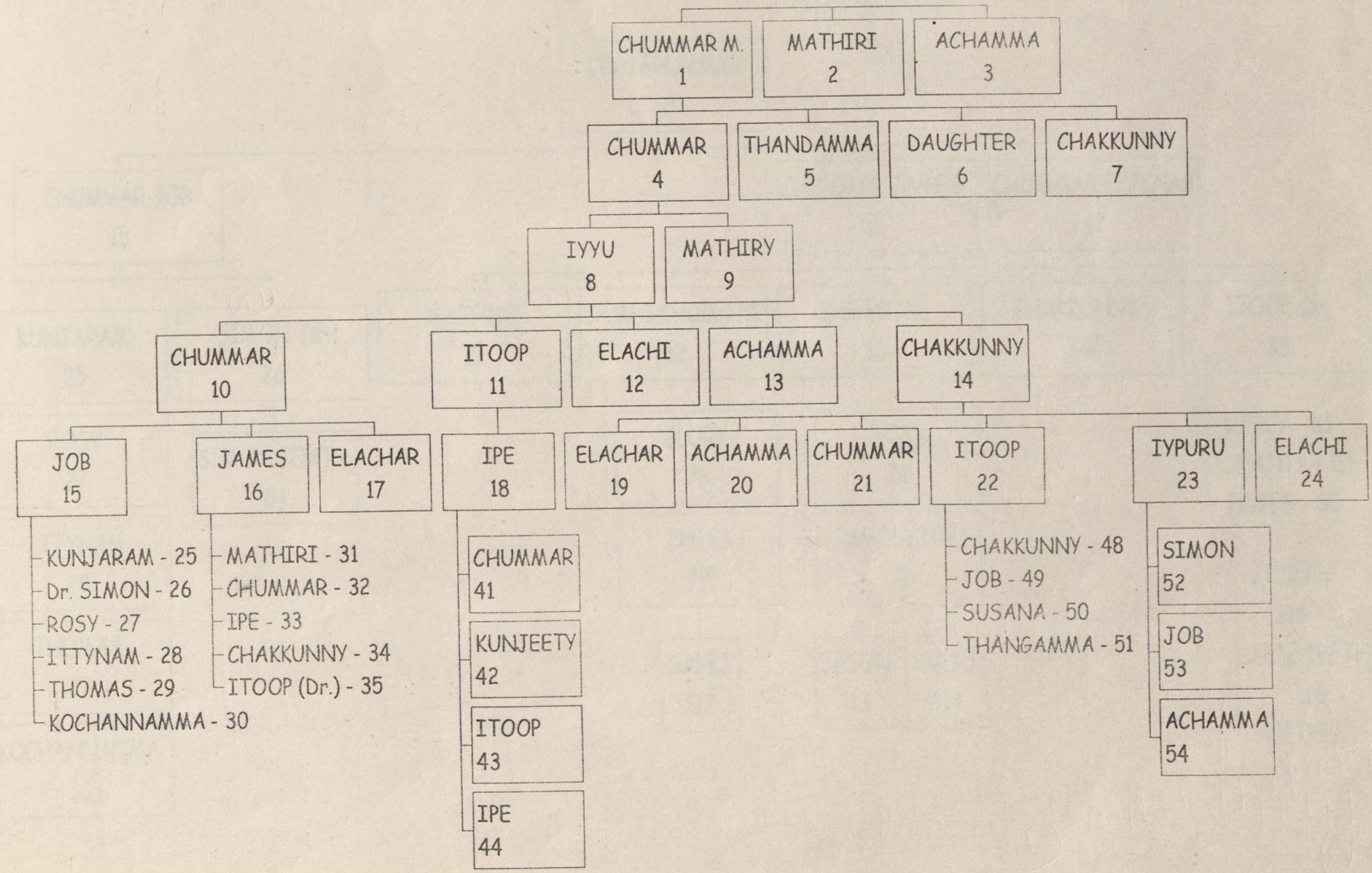

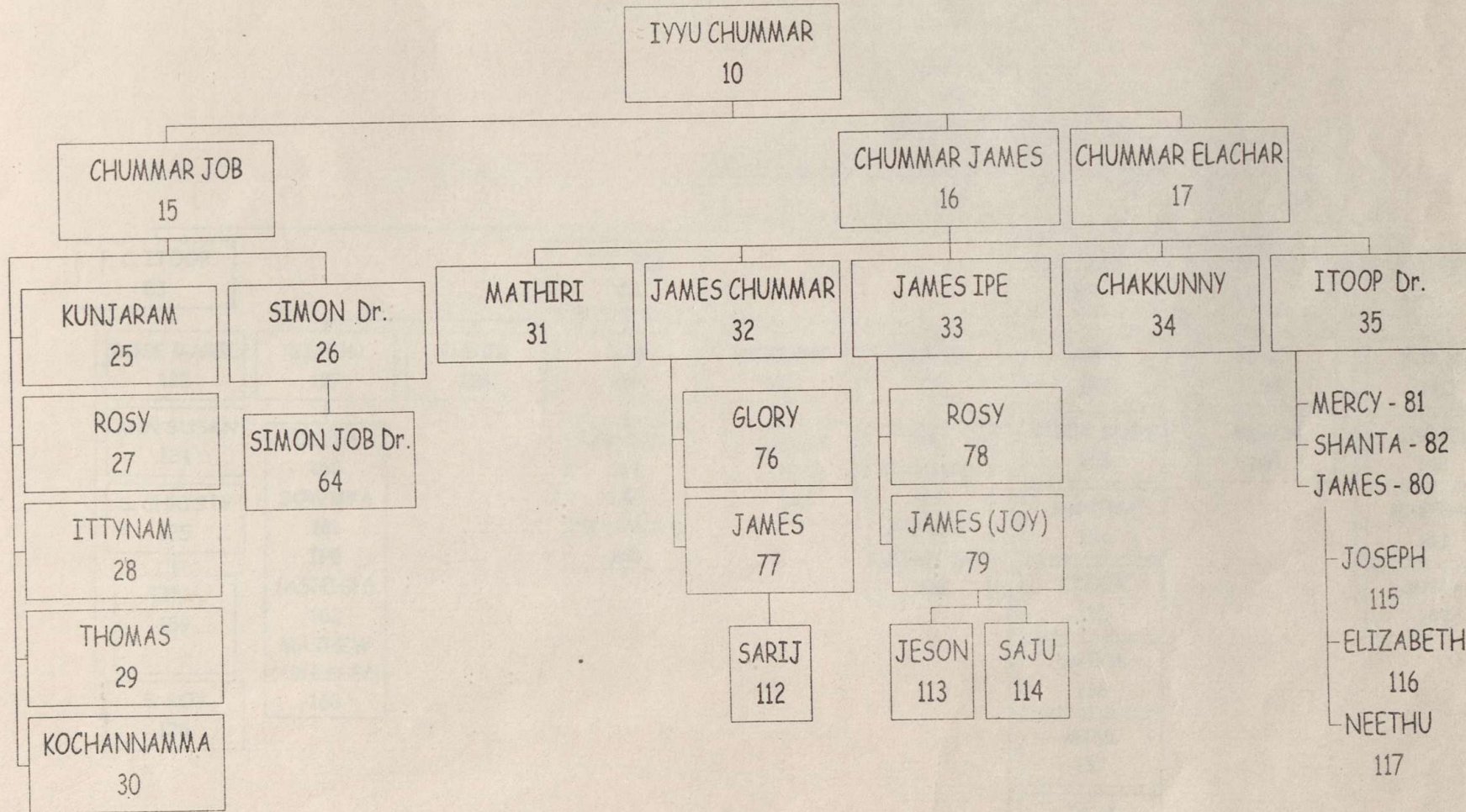

MELEH PARAMEL



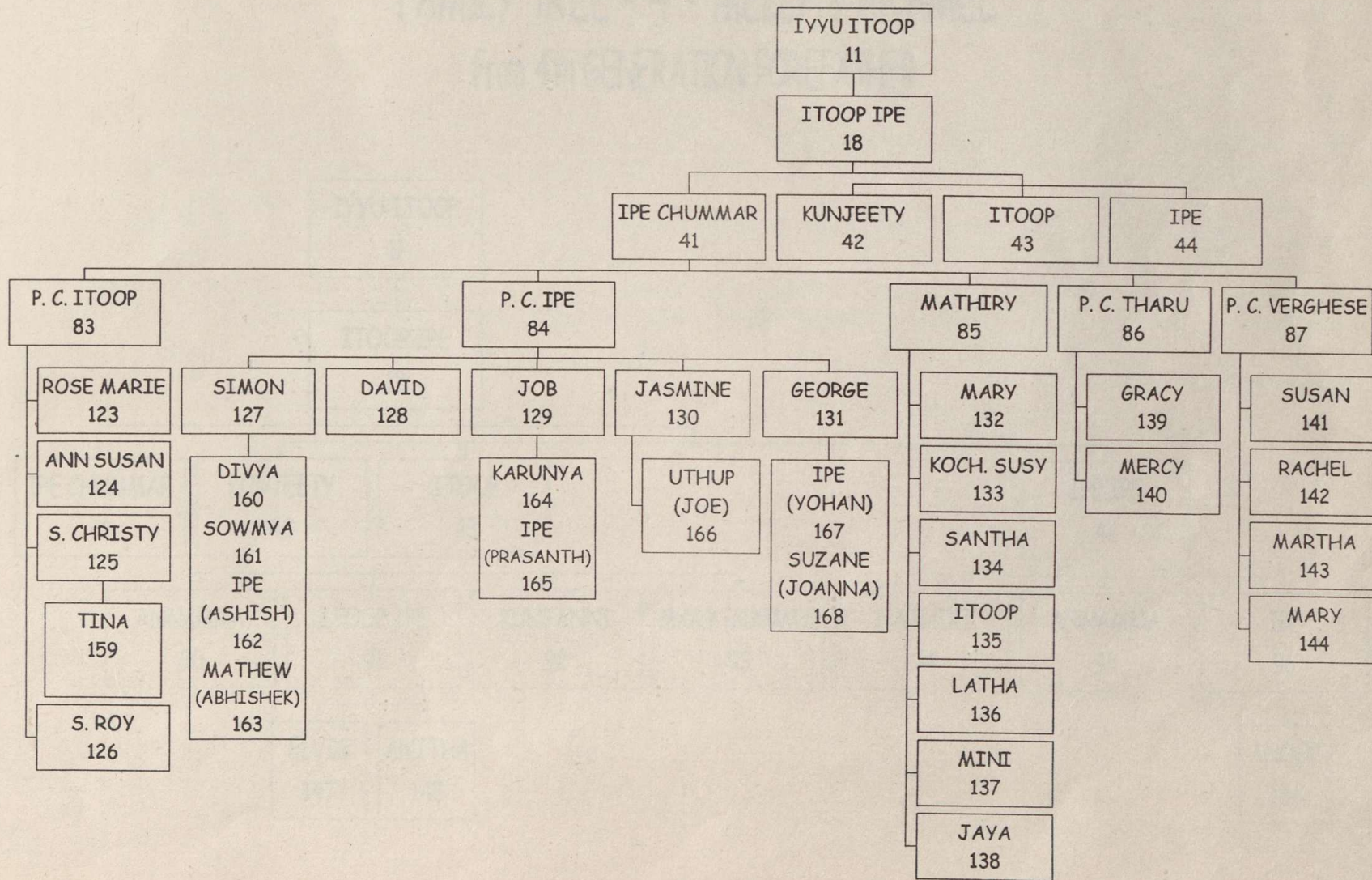
FAMILY TREE - 2 - MELEH PARAMEL

From 4th GENERATION FOREFATHER

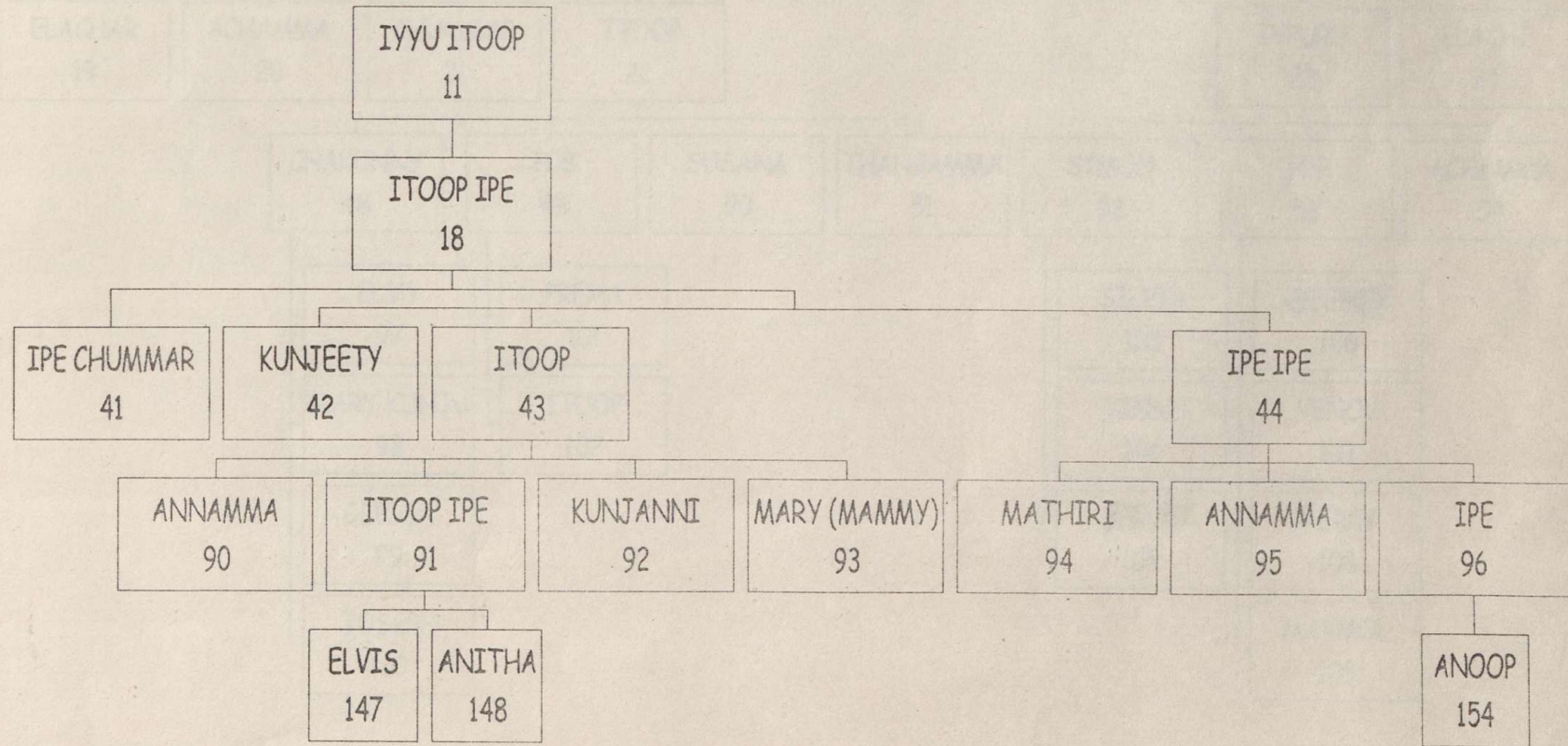


FAMILY TREE - 3 - MELEH PARAMEL

From 4th GENERATION FOREFATHER

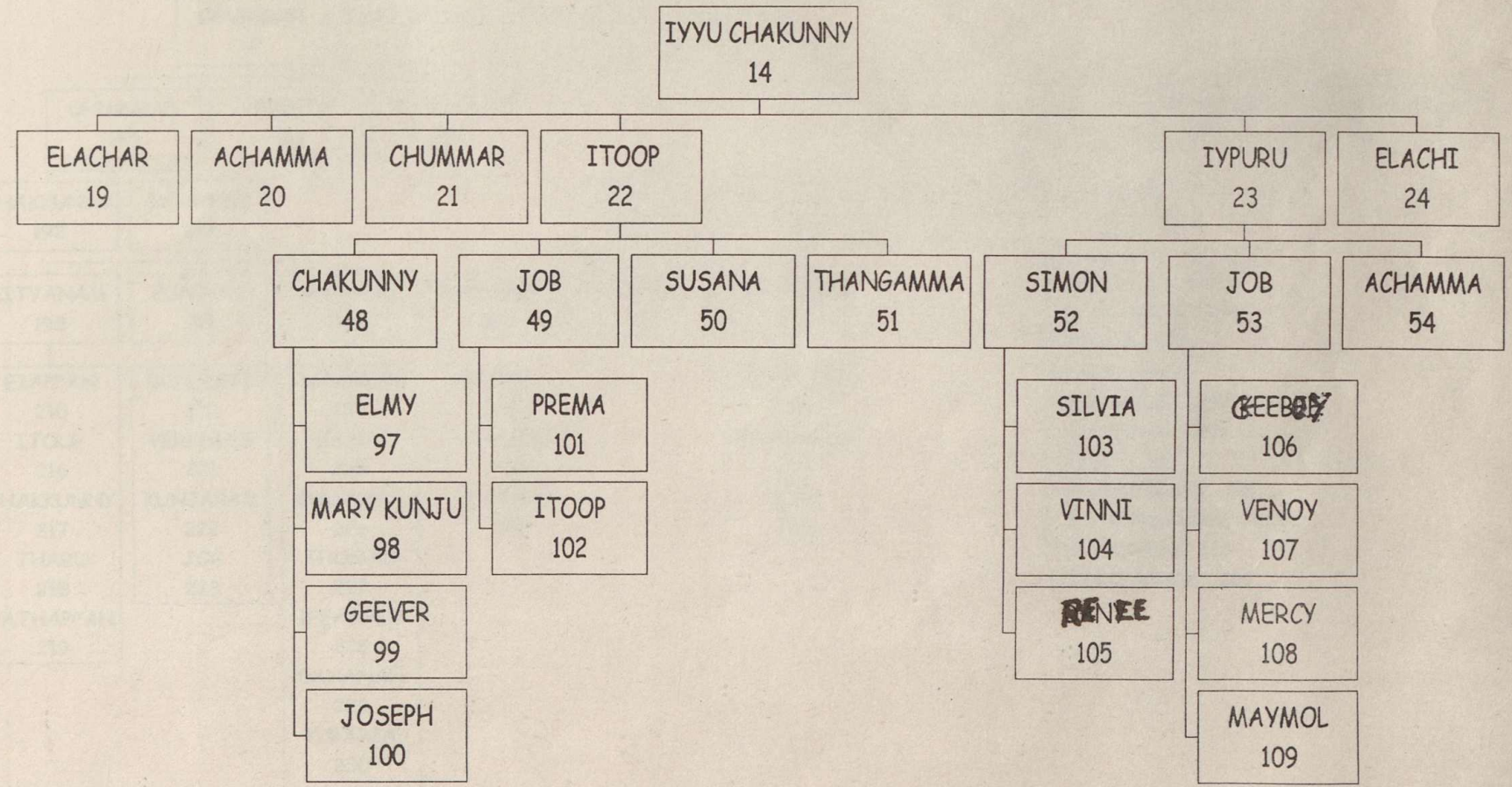


FAMILY TREE - 4 - MELEH PARAMEL
From 4th GENERATION FOREFATHER



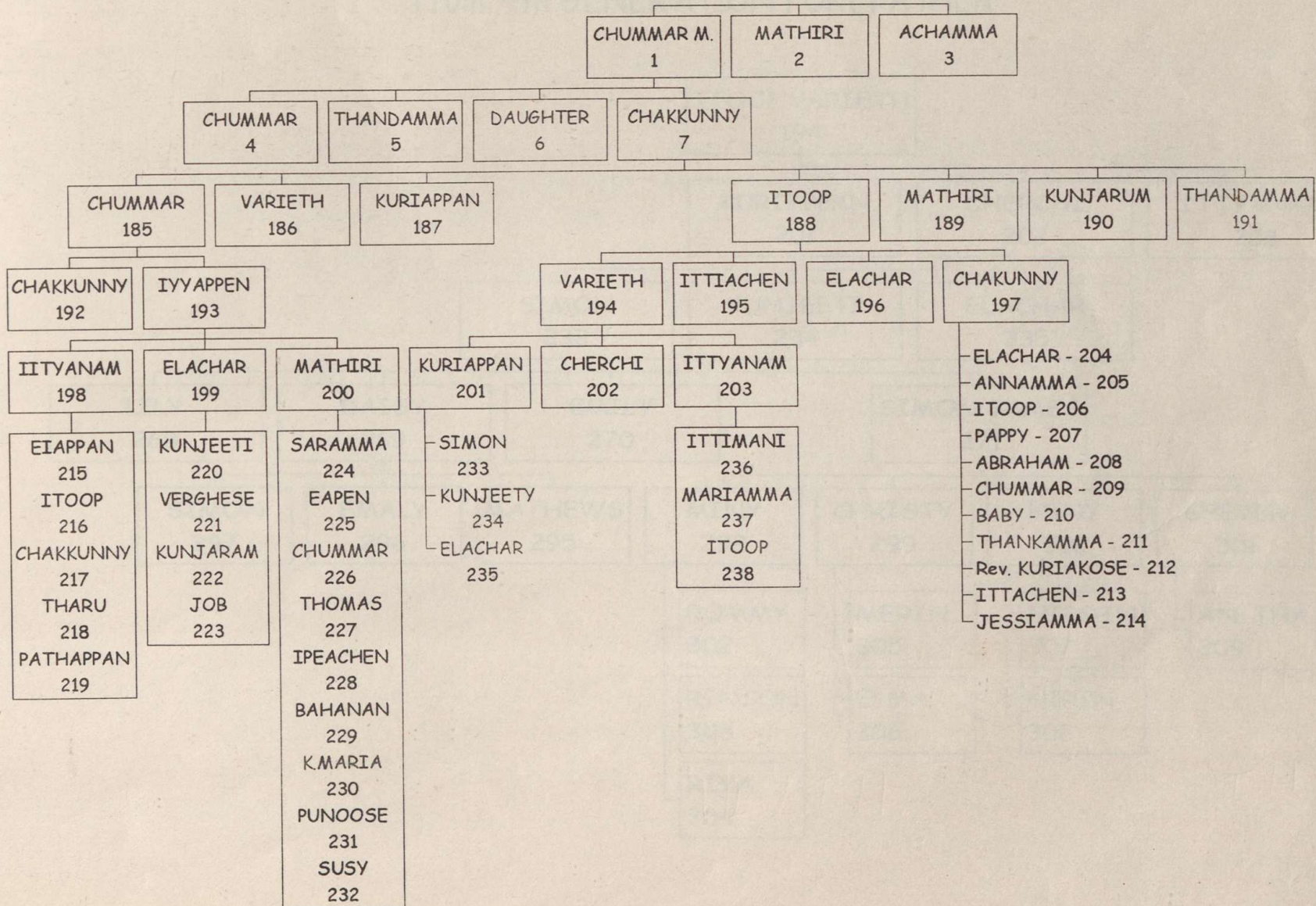
FAMILY TREE - 5 - MELEH PARAMEL

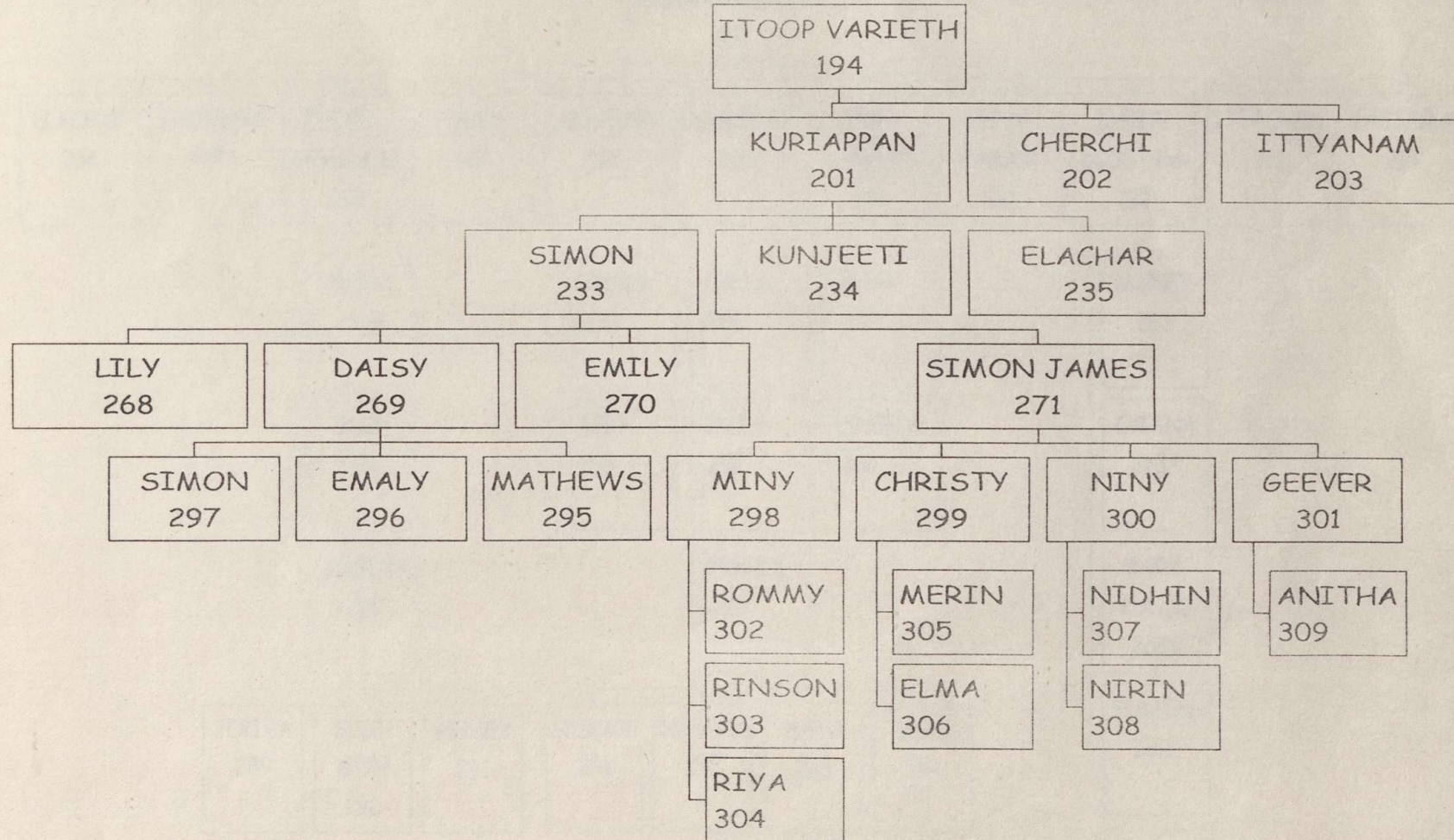

THAZHE PARAMEL



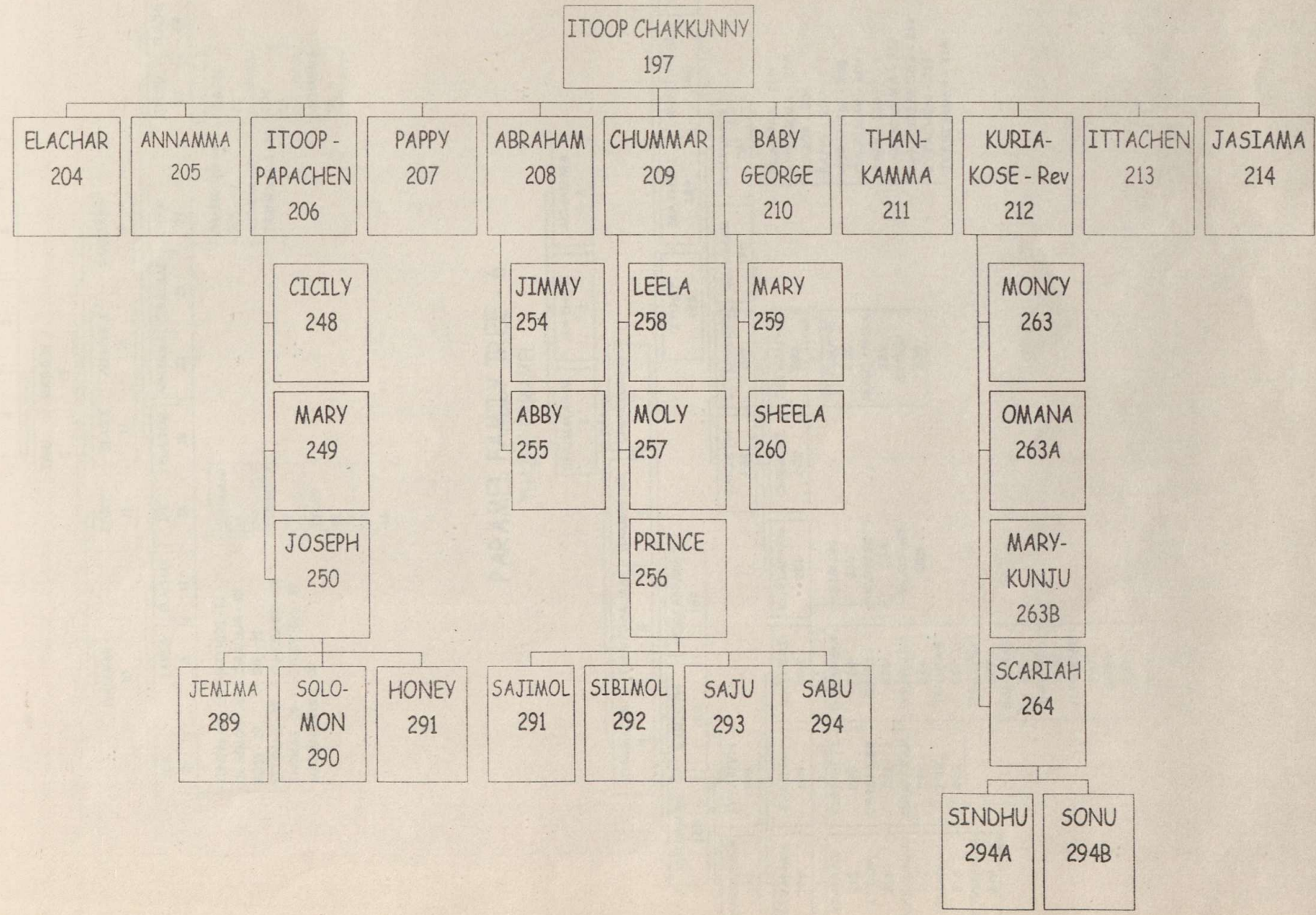
FAMILY TREE - 7 - THAZHE PARAMEL
