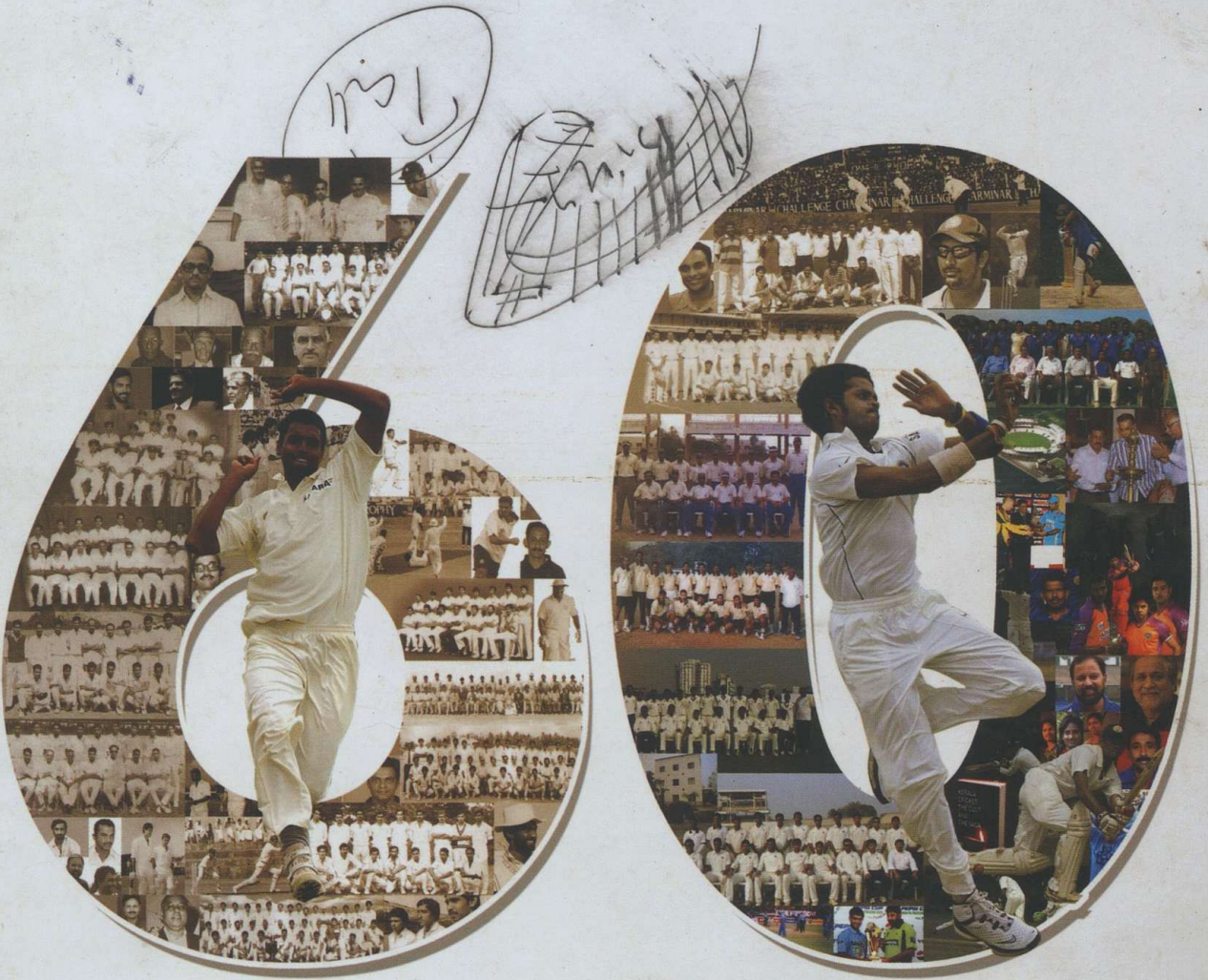

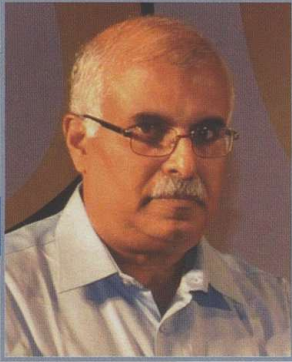

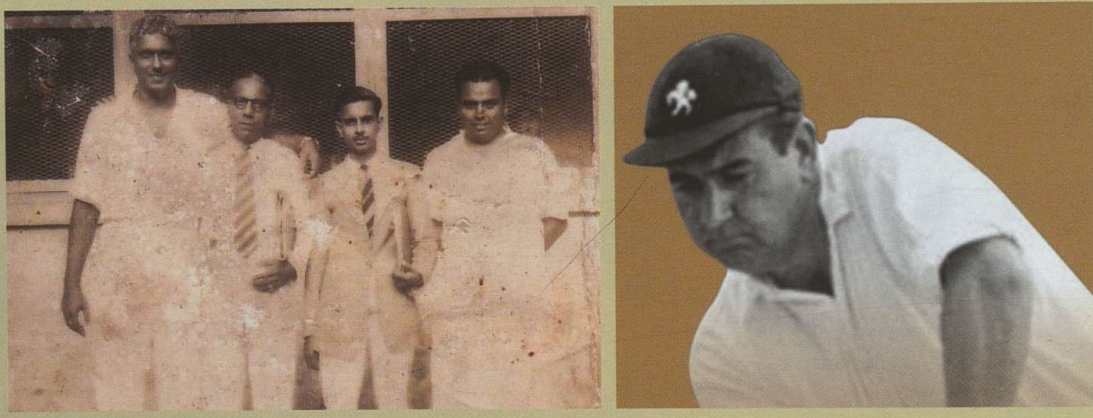
Col. Godavarma Raja



The greatest figure who dominated Travancore-Cochin and Kerala Cricket like a colossus was the legendary Col. Godavarma Raja of the Travancore Royal Family. A Prince among sportsmen and a sportsman among princes, Col. Raja was responsible for putting Kerala in the sports and Tourist map of India. It was under his inspiring leadership that a few members from the Tripunithura Royal family and Cricket enthusiasts from Trivandrum and Kottayam met in 1950 and formed Travancore- Cochin Cricket Association. From this later emerged Kerala Cricket Association.

Calm must have been the middle name of Col. Godavarma Raja. He possessed the Midas touch, no doubt was CEO of all sports and games organisations in the State. A keen sportsman himself he played all the games, though he had a weakness for tennis and polo. It was his great vision that led to the development of Kovalam as one of the finest beaches in the world and commissioning of the Trivandrum airport. He was seldom found in the palace, he was here, there and every where personality monitoring all activities.

KERALA CRICKET IN A NUTSHELL



The home of Kerala Cricket is the tiny little town of Tellicherry, sandwiched between Kannur, up north and Mahe (a former French Colony) of the British Malabar area. The game originated around the year 1800. It is said that Lord Wellesley, who was stationed at Tellicherry, regularly played the game at Tellicherry and "The Town Cricket Club", one of the oldest Cricket Clubs to be established, was a hub of cricket activity drawing its members from the elite of the society. The great Colin Cowdrey had his baptism in cricket in the cricket grounds of Tellicherry. Then there was the legendary Kunhippakki, the palm tree hitter. He strongly believed that the ball is to be hit and that too with all the might one could muster. Crowds gathered just to see him bat and loft the red cherry over trees and house tops. He would have proved an ideal one day player. CK Klansman, the Olympian, was another Titan. He could well be called the forerunner of Baud Macaroni of the 1970's. Bowling against Hobbs and Suchlike he sent down six consecutive maidens and the great pair had no answer to Asthma's wily art. Hobbs later said that batting against CK was "a unique experience".

THE FIRST DECADE

1950 to 1959 (The Beginning)

The first decade 1950 to 1959

Ranji Trophy championship was started in 1934-35 with 15 teams from the four zones. But Travancore-Cochin was granted affiliation by the BCCI in 1951 and 16 years after MJ Gopalan of Madras had the honour of sending down the first ball to mark the inauguration of the Ranji Trophy, Travancore - Cochin like a bashful bride, timidly stepped into the national scene.

The format changed in 1957-58 season with the introduction of the league system at zonal level. Under the new format the weaker teams like Kerala - as the name was changed - would get more opportunities to display their skill but the season turned out to be a big disappointment. Notable for the debut of PC Varma, who were 14 when he made his debut against Hyderabad in 1957-58.

In 1959-60 against Andhra, Kerala somehow lifted their game. In Palakkad against fellow basement dwellers, Balan Pandit stroked what was then the highest score by a Kerala player in history of Ranji Trophy. Coming to the wicket after Kerala had started disastrously, Balan Pandit added 410 runs for the fourth wicket with George Abraham who made 198. Balan Pandit went on to make 262 studded with 34 fours and two sixes. Kerala declared their innings closed at 555 for five. But Kerala still couldn't force a win as Andhra made 315 and followed on. They made 163 for four in the second innings. The win remained elusive but Kerala for the first time finished ahead of Andhra in points tally. Balan Pandit was easily the standout cricketer for Kerala in the first decade. Balan Pandit, finished the 1959-60 season with 443 runs with an average of 73.66 which included the double century against Andhra. Balan Pandit was the fulcrum of the side. A product of King George School in Bombay, Balan played his club cricket in Bombay for Hindu Gymkhana. Blessed with all strokes in the book, Balan could cut and pull with equal felicity. He was an elegant batsman and was agile and swift behind the stumps. He was the first real hero for budding Kerala cricketers to emulate. He was invited to play for Kerala by none other than Col.G.V.Raja. When Balan Pandit came cricket was in a state of Infancy in Kerala.

Balan Pandit's batting, Ravi Achan's spin bowling and C.K.Bhaskar's steady medium pace bowling were the bright spots for Kerala in the first decade of Ranji Trophy cricket.



THE SECOND DECADE

1960 to 1969 (The turnaround)

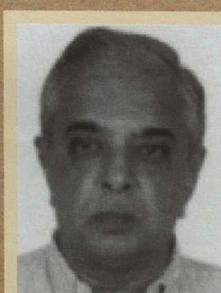
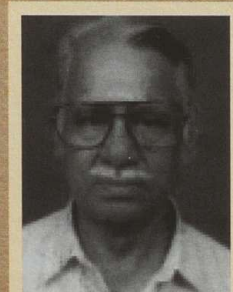
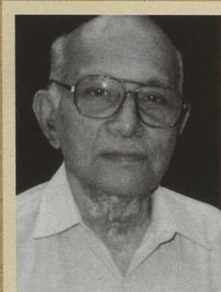
The Kerala Cricket Association roped in former Indian captain Lt.Col. Hemu Adhikari and he conducted a camp in Thiruvananthapuram. Kerala players benefited from his fielding drills.

Kerala won its first Ranji Trophy match under the captaincy of Balan Pandit in December 1960. The match played at Guntur saw Kerala defeat Andhra by an innings and five runs. It was the 22nd match that Kerala was playing.

1965-66 season Kerala winning their third match in Ranji Trophy. A draw against Madras albeit due to bad weather saw Kerala enjoy one of its best seasons in its brief history.

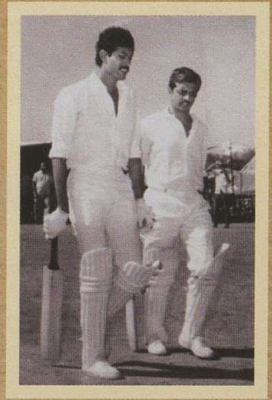
Kerala made history at Sirpur when they defeated Hyderabad by one wicket and registered their first win against the heavy weight side of the zone. Medium pacer Kalyanasundram (10 for 107) was the architect of the win.

Another decade ended with Kerala fighting to gain recognition. It was notable achievement for C.K.Bhaskar who was selected to represent India for the unofficial Test against Ceylon. Balan Pandit continued to defy age and was the most successful batsman for Kerala of the decade. His comrade in arms Ravi Achan strove manfully with the ball but these two influential cricketers were on their last legs and Kerala with a plethora of youngsters looked the next decade with hope.



THE THIRD DECADE

1970 to 1979
(Some improvement)



The Third decade 1970 to 1979

The 70's marked the beginning of a new era in Kerala cricket.

Kerala started the 1971-72 season with a bang. They defeated Andhra at Cannanore. The young Amarjit Singh turned out to be the hero and returned the best figures ever by a Kerala bowler in the history of Ranji Trophy. The match was delicately poised with Kerala's tail waging to take a 41-run first innings lead. Amarjit Singh bowled with control and guile to take nine for 45 off 12.3 overs to dismiss visitors for 139 runs. Kerala hit the required 99 without much fuss. It was Kerala's first win after five years in the competition.

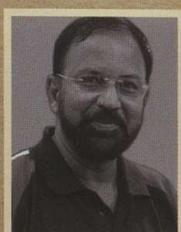
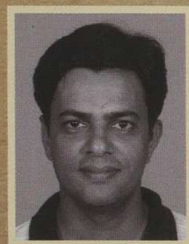
There was lot to cheer for Kerala in 1979-80 season. For the first time, Kerala managed to hold Karnataka to a draw in a match that saw pugnacious left-hander A.Satyendran play the innings of his life (128 not out). Kerala failed to beat Andhra in a rain curtailed match at Quilon but nevertheless took the first innings lead to take five points.

The third decade ended with Kerala failing to assert itself against the big three. OK Ramdoss, A.Satyendran, Mohd. Ibrahim and J.K.Mahendra were on their last legs or had retired. S.Ramesh, M.Ranjith Thomas and K.Jayaraman were beginning to show promise. Kerala at the start of the 80s was in process of rebuilding.



THE FOURTH DECADE

1980 to 1989
(A definite improvement)



The Forth decade 1980 to 1989

A definite improvement

A new season beckoned Kerala but with a young team which was struggling to find its feet, the chances of the team doing well in 1980-81 season was remote.

The only consolation for Kerala was that their captain Jayaraman played in the Kerala's Chief Minister's XI led by Gavaskar that took on the touring MCC side in the benefit match of Govind Bawaji at Trivandrum in 1981.

A late order rally only delayed the inevitable. The gain for the season 1986-87 was a memorable year for Kerala cricket. K.Jayaraman entered the record books by scoring four centuries that season to join a select band of 12 others who had earlier achieved a similar feat in Ranji Trophy. Overall it was a fine season for Kerala and Jayaraman topped the zonal chart with 589 runs at Bradmanesque average of 98.16.

Another decade ended. S.Ramesh who had led the side astutely bowed down after the 1989-90 season. Though he led Kerala in 24 matches and could only win only two matches, it was Ramesh who instilled a self belief in the players. He coaxed them to aim high and showed the way with his spirited batting and bowling. No doubt Jayaraman with four centuries became the most prolific Kerala batsmen of that decade that saw the emergence of Ananthapadmanabhan as a good leg spinner. Hariharan was still going strong but was on his last legs. A few experienced players left the scene but the team still had some young players who capable of chasing the elusive second round spot. India's victory in Prudential World Cup in 1983 changed the whole perception about the game in the early 80's. The fever that swept across the country didn't spare Kerala which was essentially a football crazy State. The television opened up new visitors and commercial houses. The small box brought real time heroes into the drawing room. Thanks to live telecast, people could watch Test matches and one-day internationals from the comfort of their homes. Needless to say, many youngsters were hooked to the game seeing their stars in action on the field. The ordinary Keralite including women started watching, discussing cricket matches. In the 80's cricket replaced football and politics the twin obsession of Malayali.

Every inch of free space in the courtyard, in the park, in the field, was gobbled up by cricket. The change was inevitable. They say only through quantity comes quality. Suddenly the 80's saw swarms of Malayalis getting hooked on to the game. Cricket began to be played in remote areas of the State and it spread to every nook and corner of the State. The 80's saw the birth of new clubs which were formed by enthusiastic youngsters to give shape to their dreams.

THE FIFTH DECADE

1990 to 1999

(The Metamorphosis)



An extra day was added to the Ranji Trophy matches from 1990-91 season and it was a test on the temperament of the batsmen and perseverance of the bowlers. Kerala started the decade on a new wicket, a few stalwarts had bowed out and finding replacement was a hard task. Nevertheless, Kerala fielded relatively a young team and a fourth place finish with victories against Andhra and Goa was heartwarming indeed. But the loss to big three showed that the young turks still had a long way to go.

1994-95 season was the Annus Mirabilis or the year of wonders for Kerala Cricket. Kerala qualified for the first time to knock out stage of the Ranji Trophy. They did with a match to spare at Victoria College ground at Palakkad defeating Tamil Nadu which itself was their first over Tamil Nadu. The long wait was finally over for the die hard cricket fans of the State.

However, with 16 points Kerala finished second in the group and qualified for the knock stage for the first time. Kerala took on Uttar Pradesh at Lucknow in the pre-quarterfinals.

In 1996-97 season, It was a momentous occasion for Kerala cricket when it won the South Zone Ranji Trophy league championship for the first time in the history of competition. The 45 year wait was finally over for chauvinist fans and it was the metamorphosis which they were hoping for. Kerala had become the champions and shrugged off their image as the whipping boys of the zone. The season was full of surprises with Karnataka sliding to the cellar position in the table something which was can happen only in the realms of fantasy. Goa took the fourth position after upsetting the former championship in the opening league fixture. KN Ananthapadmanabhan becomes the second Kerala players to hit a double century against Orissa at Cuttack. Promoted up the order, Ananthan repaid the faith imposed in him by coach Satyendran. Coming to the wicket after the early loss of his brother Balasubramaniam, Ananthan quickly found his touch. He reached his maiden double hundred (200). B Ramprakash and Ananthapadmanabhan were picked to represent South Zone in Duleep Trophy.

Kerala growing stature was reflected in the selection of Ananthapadmanabhan for the Challenger Trophy one-day tournament. He also got a chance to play for the India 'A' against Australia at Jamshedpur. He made 15 not out and scalped the wickets three Australian wickets for 71 runs. But his moment under the sun came against Pakistan at Kochi. Representing the Board President's XI, Ananthan took five for 80 off 23 overs. His victims were Wasti, Saeed Anwar, Inzamam, Moin Khan and Azhar Mahmood. But a Test cap remained elusive for Kerala player but the wait will soon be over.

THE SIXTH DECADE

2000 to 2009
(Mixed fortunes)



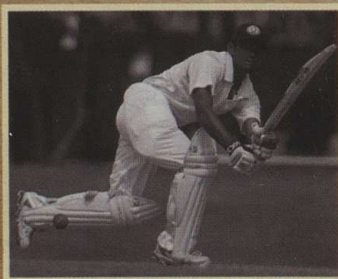
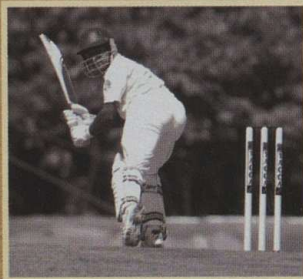
A new millennium beckoned. The 90's saw the coming of age of Kerala cricket. The popularity of the game transcended all boundaries and there were genuine attempts to nurture the game at grass root level in the State by the Kerala Cricket Association. The acceptance of the game among middleclass and the mushrooming of the cricket academies throughout the State were indications of the growing popularity of the game. And with the decline of traditional sports in the State, cricket was looking ahead at a bright future.

In 2002-03 the Rani Trophy format underwent a big change. The BCCI introduced the elite and plate category. Based on the ranking in the previous season, Kerala was placed in the plate category. The KCA which celebrated its Golden Jubilee the previous year responded by inducing a few changes in the squad. C Hemant Kumar (Tamil Nadu) and Sujith Somasunder (Karnataka) were drafted in to strengthen the fragile batting line-up. Former India player Abey Kuruvilla was appointed as coach. Kerala was grouped along with Goa, Saurashtra, Tripura, Services and Vidharbha in the plate division.

In 2003-04 season, The side took on Himachal Pradesh in the first match at Palakkad. Though, the match ended in a draw it was memorable for Sreesanth who became the first Kerala player to take a hat-trick in Ranji Trophy. Sreesanth had centurion Bista caught behind in the last ball of the 92nd over of the Himachal's innings and with his first two deliveries of the 94th over dismissed Mannu and Dogra to complete the hat-trick.

In 2007-08 season, KCA appointed Vedam Hariharan as the coach for the season. The team performed creditably and entered the semi-finals. It was indeed a positive achievement. Kerala took on Services at Palakkad and the match was memorable for Sreekumar Nair who scored the highest individual score by a Kerala batsman in the history of Ranji Trophy. Sreekumar Nair batted more than ten and a half hours to score 306 strutted with 37 fours.

The KCA has since then started their preparation for Ranji Trophy quite early this season. A squad interspersed with senior and junior players was selected quite early and as part of preparation the team has been taking part in all-India tournaments. Cricket aficionados are hoping that the team will end the decade on a high note with a good performance in this season's Ranji Trophy.

Kerala ranji trophy in ELITE GROUP 1994-95, 1996-97

1994-95 season was the Annus Mirabilis or the year of wonders for Kerala Cricket. Kerala qualified for the first time to knock out stage of the Ranji Trophy and played Pre-Quarter-Final match against Uttar Pradesh at KD Singh Babu Stadium, Lucknow from 12 to 16 February 1995 and the drawn match saw Uttar Pradesh winning on the basis of first innings lead.

1996-97 season was a momentous occasion for Kerala cricket when it won the South Zone Ranji Trophy league championship for the first time in the history of competition. The 45 year wait was finally over for chauvinist fans and it was the metamorphosis which they were hoping for. Kerala had become the champions and shrugged off their image as the whipping boys of the zone.

In 2002-03 season the Rani Trophy format underwent a big change. The BCCI introduced the elite and plate category. Based on the ranking in the previous season, Kerala was placed in the plate category. The KCA which celebrated its Golden Jubilee the previous year responded by inducing a few changes in the squad and Kerala win the Group A Plate title and promoted to Elite Group

T 20 - Qualified to play in KNOCK OUT 2010-11



The Kerala Seniors came out with a sterling performance in the T-20 Zonal league phase and qualified for the knock out phase of the Syed Mustaq Ali trophy for the first time. Kerala came runners-up in the league phase beating fancied Hyderabad, Karnataka and Goa convincingly. The team lost to Tamil Nadu and the match against Andhra was abandoned due to rain. Placed second in the league phase, the team qualified for the All India knock-out stage. Kerala lost to Haryana in the quarter-finals.

The team led by Raiphi Vincent Gomez played consistently well. The outstanding performers were the skipper Raiphi Gomez, Robert Fernandez, and P. Prasanth.

Kerala under-19 team qualified to play in ELITE GROUP 2010-11



Kerala under-19 team created history with its sterling performance this season and qualified to play in the Elite group in the next season. Playing in the Plate - A group, the team after initial set-backs against Rajasthan, Himachal and Orissa came back strongly to win outright against Goa and Orissa. Placed second in the group, Kerala ensured a win against Andhra to play in the Elite group next season. In the quarter-finals of the knock out phase, Kerala gave a good fight to Gujarat before conceding first innings lead.

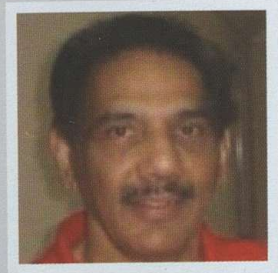

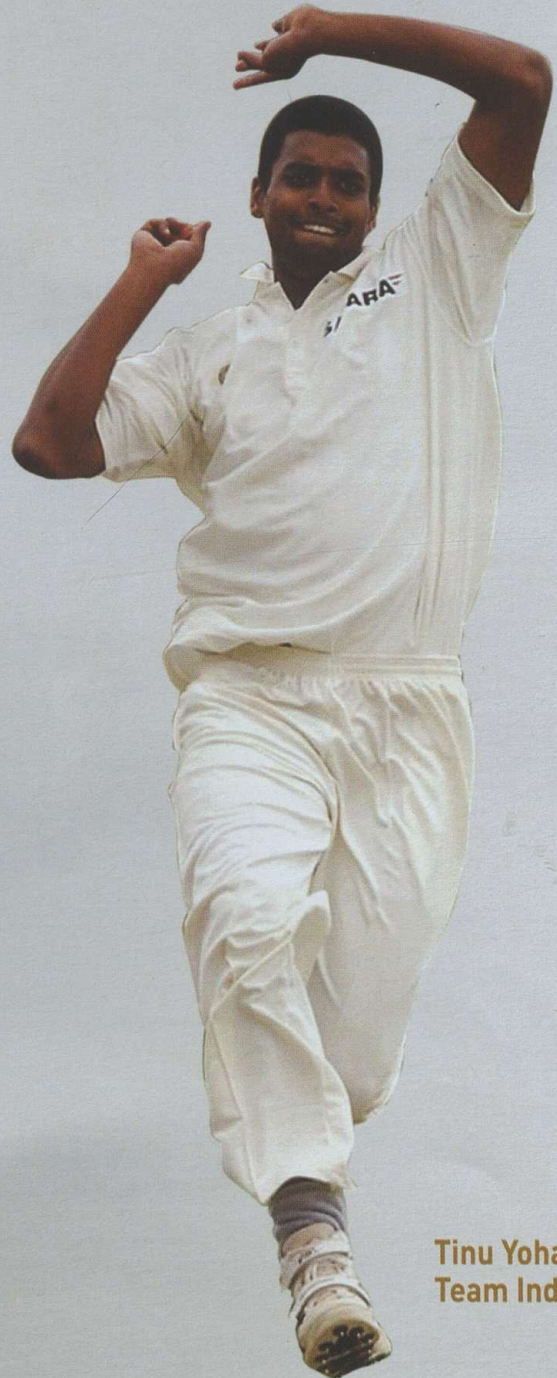

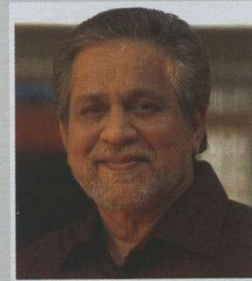

WOMENS CRICKET IN KERALA

The performance of Kerala women in sports has been commendable over the years, but one area where it has taken a backseat is their exploits on the cricket field. Kerala women first started playing cricket almost 35 years ago but the standards of the game remained exactly where they began in Kerala until the Kerala Cricket Association took over the administration recently. In the beginning the Women's cricket centered on Smt. Sarada Teacher, who single handedly built up the game in Kerala.

The history of women's cricket in Kerala can be divided into two segments. Before 2006 where it was administrated by the Kerala State Women's Cricket Association, and after 2006 when the Kerala Cricket Association took over.

1975 to 1983 – The game was played only in three cities namely Calicut, Ernakulam and Trivandrum. A number of Kerala players represented the South Zone during these period namely Prabha Alice Varkey, , Varsha Metha, etc.

1983 to 1990 – Girls in more towns started playing the game. Place like Palakkad, Trichur, Kottayam and Kannur also had women's cricket during this period. Baby Shakkeela, Hafsa, Sreekala and Deepa were the prominent playerswho represented the South Zone

1990-1997 –Kerala become champions of the newly introduced sub junior south zone championship under the captaincy of AP Sabeja. Kerala became runner up in the under 19 section of South Zone championship too again under the captaincy of Sabeja . A number of players were selected for the southern railways namely Padma, T Shobana etc.

1997 – 2005– During this period, it was Palakkad and Malappuram all the way as they kept on winning most of the tournaments until the newly formed Pathanamthitta emerged as the champions in the 2005 Senior Women's championship in Thiruvalla. The Kerala seniors for the first time had a victory against Andhra in that year's South Zone nationaland were runners up .

There was a marked improvement after the affairs of the Women's cricket was taken over by KCA. Kerala's status had a rise among the others as they got the following positions.

KCA has begun a programme to attract women from other sports to take up cricket as a second game so that we could have a wider base KCA has also plans to catch them young and started concentrating on schools. The KCA has started to send coaches to all the districts and at least 10 schools and colleges have been provided 'nets' facilities."

The standard of women's cricket in Kerala promises to become at par with other games in Kerala.

VETERANS CRICKET ASSOCIATION



Kerala, the God's own country is considered by many as the birth place of the game of Cricket in India.

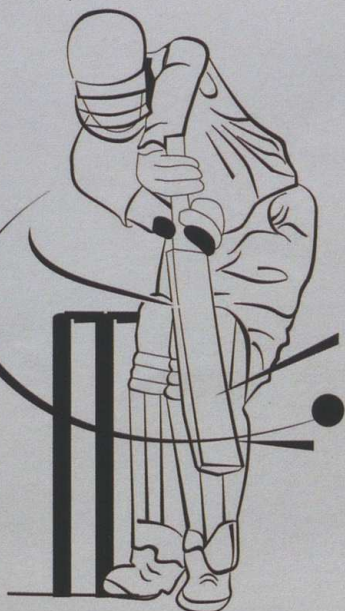
Cricket has always been a game with a distinct English connection and it was Col.Sir Arthur Wellesley, who brought the game to Tellicherry, the small but historical town in Northern Kerala in 1800s. Later, the game in its true tradition was kept alive by the famous cricket families like the Mampallys, Nakkads and the Acharaths in north while the royal families of Tripunithura and Travancore patronized the game the central and southern parts of the state.

The veteran cricket movement also started at Tellicherry in the mid 80s, bringing together the former state cricketers to play an occasional game or two, amongst themselves or against visiting clubs. It was an event to unwind, have a glimpse of the good old days. Later, Kerala Veterans Cricket Association (KVCA), added momentum to the movement by bringing together yesteryear cricketers and others of the cricketing fraternity in the state on a single platform. In the year 2006, the Kerala Veteran's Cricket Association became an affiliate member of the Board for Veterans Cricket in India (BVCI). Our members Mr.J.K.Mahendra and Mr.D.Chandrasenan are holding the post of Vice-President and Joint Secretary of the Board for the last three years.

KVCA has been organizing overseas tours regularly for its members. During the last 10 years Veteran teams have visited UK, Austria, Denmark, Germany, Amsterdam, Portugal, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore and Srilanka not only playing the game but also spreading the message of good will and friendship across the boundaries. KVCA has hosted visiting clubs like the I Zingaries (S.A) , Romanys (UK), Haskett Cricket Club (Australia) and the Lankan Cavaliers (Sri Lanka). Kerala Veterans team also participates in the annual Inter-State veteran's championship conducted by the Board for Veteran Cricket in India.

The association has initiated a programme to provide a one time gratis to former cricketers who are not receiving any financial assistance from Board of Control for Cricket in India.

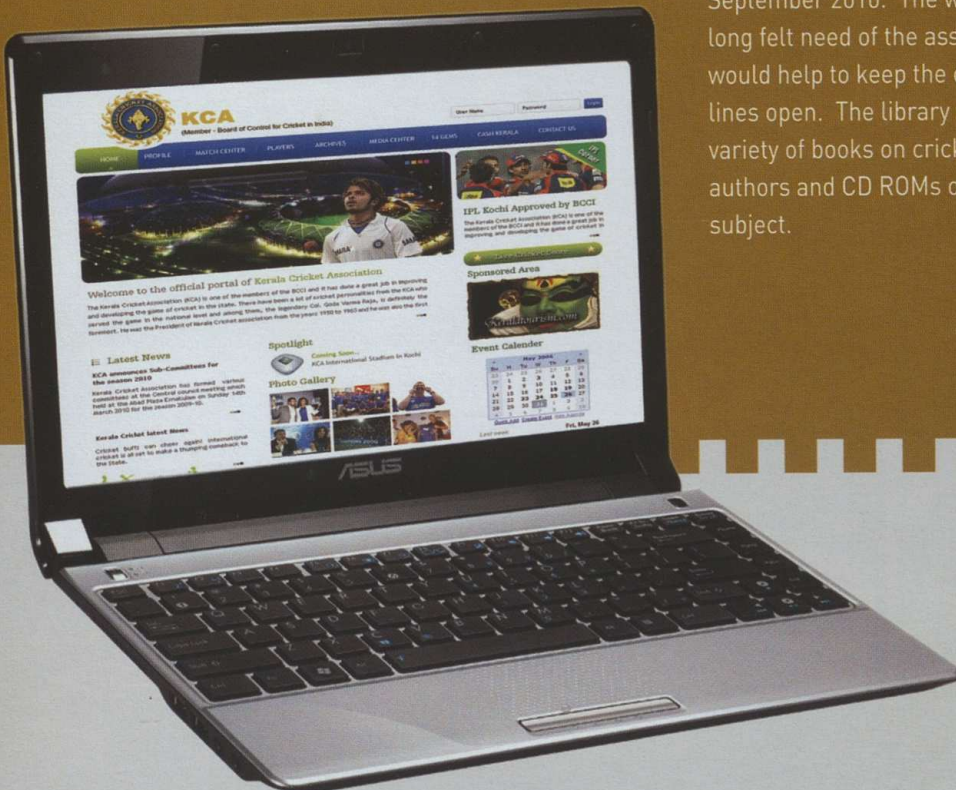
Celebrating excellence

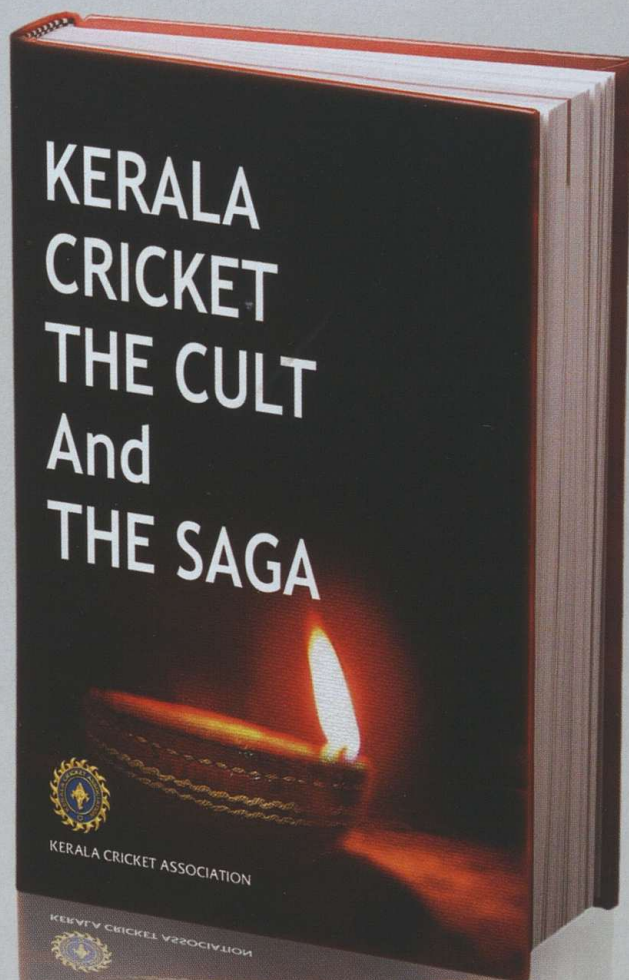
DIAMOND JUBILEE CELEBRATION & AWARD NITE

Innings Chase Record

Kerala chase the highest innings total in Ranji cricket against Goa, at Fort Maidan, Palakkad on 3,4,5,6 November 2008, Goa scored 460 and Kerala passed to lead on first innings 486.

Ranji record is the 1981/82 final when Karnataka made 705 and Delhi replied with 707-8. The First-Class record is Surrey's 707-9 declared in 1990 to which Lancashire replied with 863

Hundred in each Innings

Sambasiva Sarma becomes the first Kerala player to score hundreds in each innings of a Match in Ranji Trophy, he scored 103 and 111* against Haryana at Fort Maidan Palakkad on 16,17,18,19 November 2008 and he becomes the 58th player to achieve the record in Ranji Trophy. 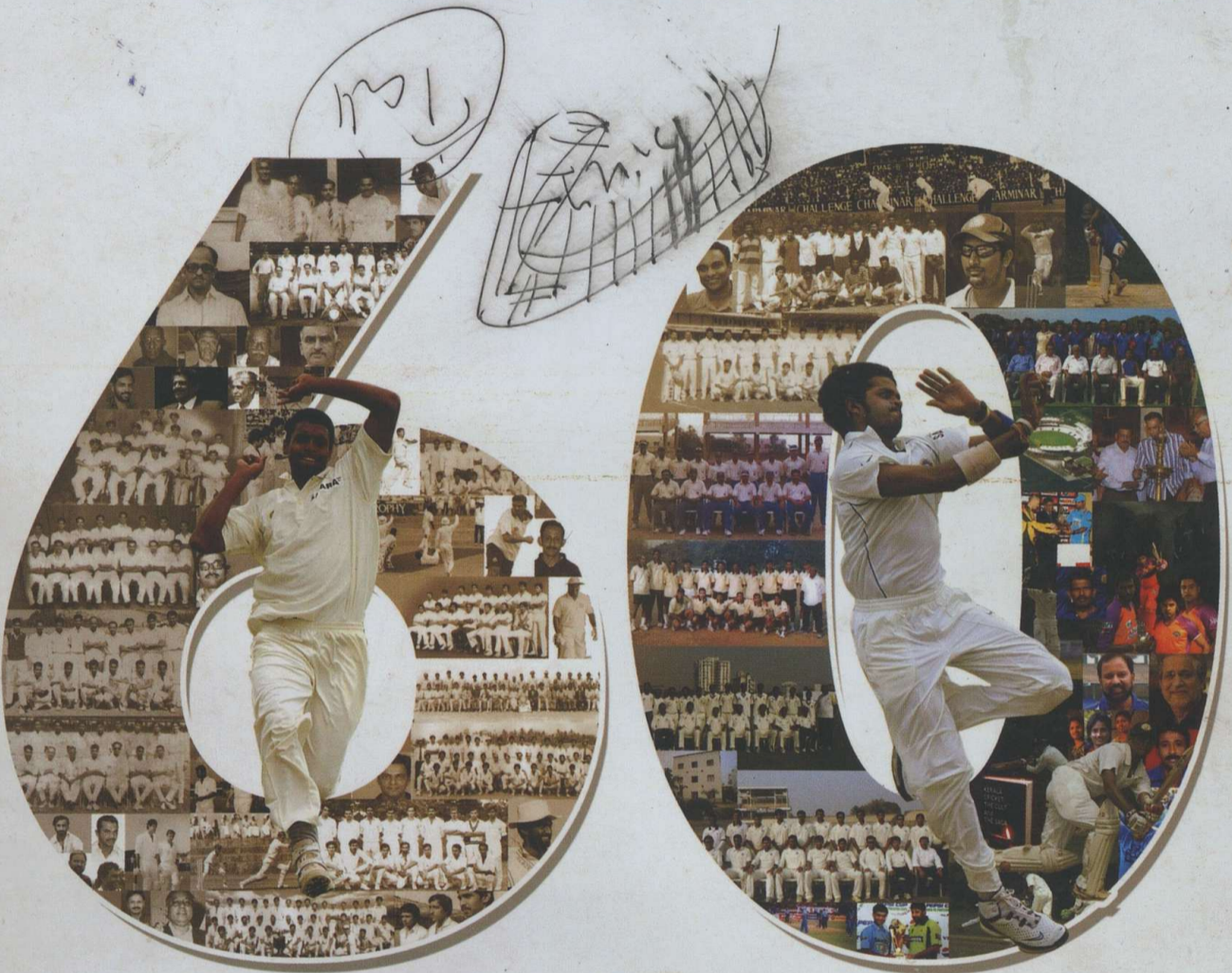
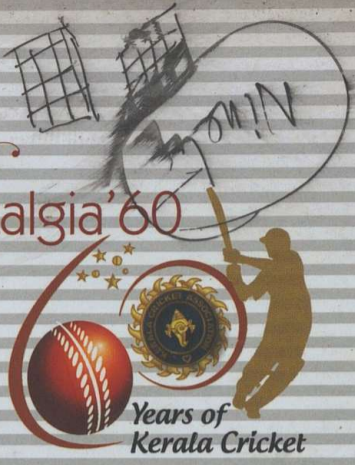
