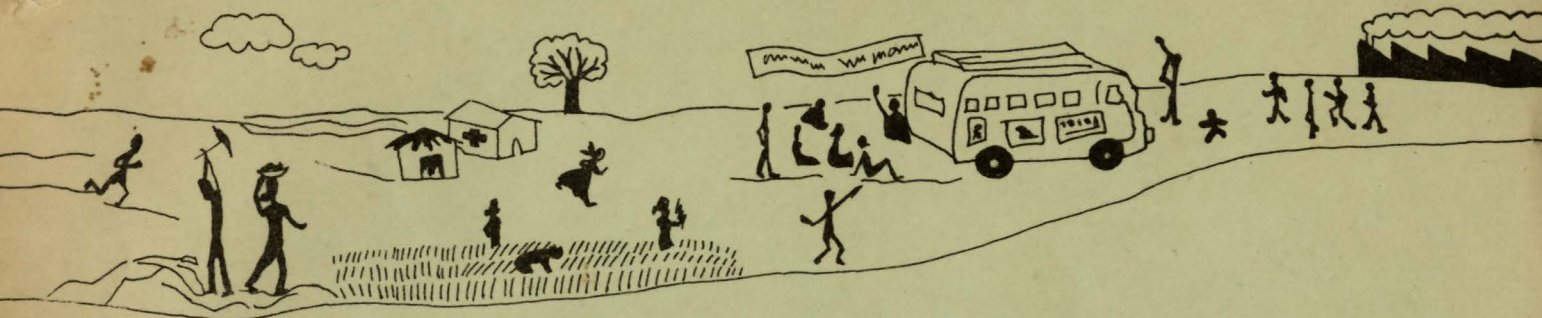

BHARAT JAN VIGYAN JATHA

October 2 - November 7, 1987

You probably know already that the Bharat Jan Vigyan Jatha, a unique and historic nationwide event in science communication, is about to begin -- on Oct. 2nd, Gandhiji's birth anniversary, reminding us of the continuing need to struggle for self-reliance. 5 zonal Jathas or mobile groups of scientists, teachers, artistes and PSM activists will be traversing over 25,000 km, holding performances at over 500 locations and converging on Bhopal to a rally of about 4000 scientists and teachers on Nov. 7, the birth anniversary of Prof.C.V.Raman. In addition to these Jathas local-level programmes will be organized continuously thus reaching directly an estimated 50 lakh people all over the country.

While 26 voluntary organizations constituted a National Organizing Committee in April this year and guided the massive preparatory tasks, today hundreds of organizations are actively involved in the Jatha committees at regional, state and local levels. The enthusiastic response from such organizations, individuals, academic institutions, governmental agencies etc. has been overwhelming. Meetings called to constitute local committees have attracted over 200 people at numerous places! The public has contributed generously to support local activities or host Jatha troupes even in flood-affected areas! Jatha committees at all levels are being swamped with requests to hold performances at schools, colleges, localities!

All this tremendous participation and support is clearly not only for this Jatha but with the expectation of continuing activities after it. The Jatha is thus not merely an event, it is a process. Over 500 local committees or activist groups have been constituted, given large quantities of communication materials for the use of which Workshops have been held at different levels attended by about 700 local-level activists. The very preparation of this material has been a collective nationwide process. The materials would, of course, be adapted, enlarged and enriched both during and after the Jatha.

All-India Workshops for plays and songs at Trivandrum, and for audio-visual material at Ahmedabad, attended by people from all states and language-areas, finalized the material for this Jatha. Regional rehearsal camps have been held for plays and songs in the respective languages. Films made for the Jatha have been dubbed in all major Indian languages, poster-exhibitions printed for communication in different languages. The products, and the process, are proud achievements of the Jatha and its slogan of National Integration: a common message effectively communicated throughout India.

The Jathas will halt, and hold performances -- the evening's being the longer and major one -- about 3 times each day. Local-level activities will also be held at these, and other, places. YOU CAN PARTICIPATE AND SUPPORT in a number of ways by helping to organize activities, involving other institutions and individuals and, above all, by joining this exciting and rewarding process.

PERSPECTIVE

The proposed all-India Science Jatha will seek to bring to the people the message that Science has placed before humankind tools which can radically change our lives. Science enables utilization of what appear to be elemental forces of nature because it provides knowledge and understanding of natural phenomena. Victory over disease, a clean and decent habitat, production of basic necessities of life are within what is achievable using existing knowledge and technology. Yet, quite often, the drive for excessive profits and reckless exploitation of natural resources utterly disregards the vital interests of the people and contributes to severe degradation of the environment. The belief that the people at large are incapable of understanding the implications of science and technology, is a myth fostered by the elite in order to preserve their own control. This control alienates science from the people and also ignores historically accumulated empirical knowledge of the people. The Jatha seeks to bring to the people a fuller awareness of the potential of science and to actively involve them in the movement to link science with the people.

The Jatha would choose and propagate themes whose content bring out the following:

- a) Understanding of the method and values of science, its sense of wonder, creativity and excitement in comprehending the World around us.
- b) Science and technology upgrades resources and skills. Under present conditions of its introduction, however, it is associated with the aggravation of inequalities and the degradation of resources used by the masses at large.
- c) Stimulation of the desire in the people for active intervention to prevent misutilization of science and technology.
- d) Mobilizing people for shaping science and technology development for their own advancement.
- e) Enhancing the social responsibility of scientists and technologists to fulfill the aspirations of the people.
- f) Values and knowledge from science bring out the common identity and destiny of the human species, and contradict and negate communal hatred pitting one section against the other.
- g) Science is the common heritage of humankind to which various peoples have contributed at different times and under certain historical conditions. Contributions by the Indian people are part of this world heritage.
- h) Contemporary achievements and innovations of scientists technologists and others towards self-reliant development of the nation.
- i) Realization of full potential of science and technology for improved quality of life of the people require a participatory mode of development.

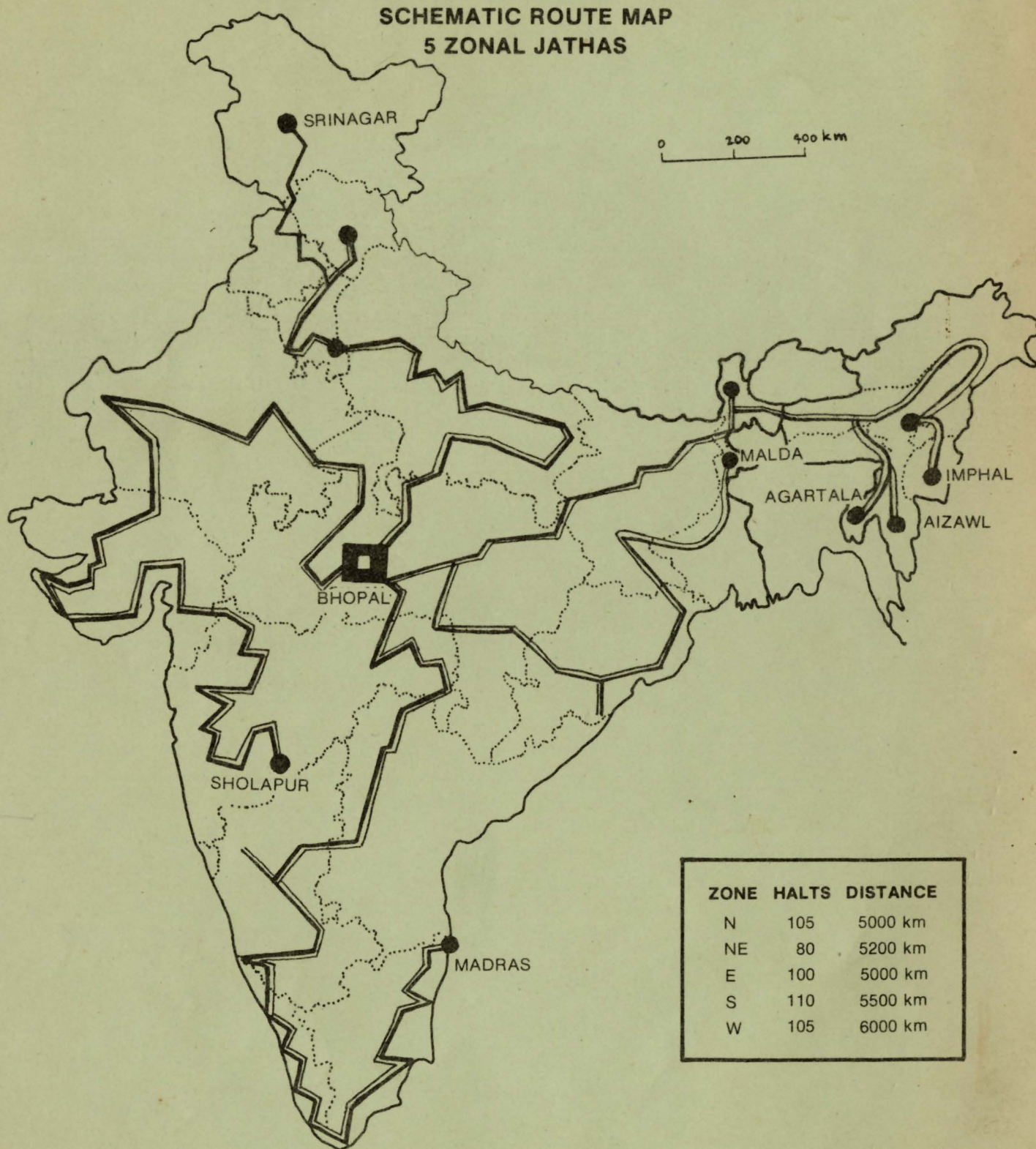
